Volunteers is a 501(c)3 national nonprofit organization established in 1991, that recruits participants to knit, crochet, and/or sew for donation to those in need (medical need or financial need). Care Wear Volunteers has compiled this booklet with basic information about donated shawls, such as preferred sizes and popular shapes. A collection of patterns at various skill levels is also in-

cluded. However, there are MANY sources of patterns including, but not limited to, books, magazines, yarn company websites, craft stores, and online craft supply companies. For this challenge, a shawl can be as simple as a 18" x 60" rectangle made with one's favorite crochet stitch or made from a pattern designed for experienced and perhaps "adventuresome" craftspersons. You are welcome to be creative. Have fun!!














# BASIC SIZES

There is no standard or required size for a shawl. You might ask where you plan to deliver the finished shawl if a particular size is requested/preferred.

# RECTANGULAR—(18"-20" X 60"—72")

Larger sizes for men and where warmth is needed. Smaller shawl sizes for petite ladies.

# TRIANGULAR—(60"-72" X 30")

Larger sizes for men and where warmth is needed. Smaller sizes for petite ladies.

# SUGGESTIONS

- 1. **WASHABLE.** Some locations request washable fiber contents such as acrylic, cotton blends, etc.
- **2. NOT WOOL?** Because of allergic reactions to wool, some sites, but not all, request other fiber contents. Check with the location where you plan to donate for any preferences that site may have.
- **3. FRINGE OR NO FRINGE?** Ask where you plan to deliver the shawl if there is a preference. Sometimes fringeless is requested for wheelchair patients.
- 4. It is assumed that donated items will be **clean** and **free of animal hair and cigarette smoke.**
- 5. **PLASTIC BAGS**. It is appreciated when finished items are packaged **in a plastic bag** to keep them clean and dust free—with a label on the outside with measured size, fiber content, and any other relevant information. Having that label saves having to open the bag and shawl to determine if it would fit and warm a large male, for example.

# 6. NO PERFUMES or FABRIC SOFTENERS or FRAGRANCES of any kind.

- 7. Storage space is usually at a minimum so making shawls in colors suitable for both males and females helps to save space. This is NOT a requirement.
- 8. **TAGS.** In addition to CGOA tags that you can download and attach to your shawl, Care Wear Volunteers has tags that may be attached. A small tag may be attached to the shawl and a large tag (with your name and mailing address) may be included with the delivery **if** you want to have a receipt sent to you. Those tags are found on the right column of the Home Page of the Care Wear Volunteers website (www.carewear.org). THE CARE WEAR VOLUNTEERS TAGS ARE **OPTIONAL**.

# **SKILL LEVEL** – EASY

# SIZES

About 19 1/2 x 60 in. (49.5 x 152.5 cm)

# MATERIALS

- LION BRAND<sup>®</sup> COBOO<sup>®</sup> (Art. #835) #143 Lilac 4 balls
- LION BRAND<sup>®</sup> crochet hook size I-9 (5.5 mm)
- LION BRAND<sup>®</sup> large-eyed blunt needle

# GAUGE

13 hdc = about 4 in. (10 cm). EXACT GAUGE IS NOT ESSENTIAL FOR THIS PROJECT.

# **STITCH EXPLANATIONS**


cross-dc (crossed double crochet - worked over 2 sts) Skip next st, dc in next st, dc in skipped st.

#### Fhdc (Foundation half double crochet)

- 1. Ch 2 (does not count as a st), yarn over, insert hook in 2nd ch from hook and draw up a loop; yarn over and draw through one loop on hook (the "chain"); yarn over and draw through 3 loops on hook (the "half double crochet").
- 2. Yarn over, insert hook into the "chain" of the half double crochet just made and draw up a loop; yarn over and draw through one loop on hook (the "chain"), yarn over and draw through 3 loops on hook (the "half double crochet"); repeat from \* the total number of times indicated.

# NOTES

- 1. Shawl is worked back and forth in rows, from one long edge across to the other long edge.
- 2. Multiple crochet sts are used to make the Shawl but all of the sts are easy!
- 3. This design begins with a row of foundation half double crochet (Fhdc). If you prefer, you can beg with a traditional foundation ch and a row of half double crochet sts, as follows: Ch 197, hdc in 2nd ch from hook (skipped ch 1 does not count as a st) and in each ch across you will have 196 hdc in this row. Proceed to Row 1 instruction.

# SHAWL

Fhdc 196.
Rows 1-5: Ch 1, turn, hdc in each st across.
Row 6: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across.
Row 7: Ch 1, turn, cross-dc across – you will have 98 cross-dc in this row.
Row 8: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across.
Row 9: Ch 4 (counts as tr), turn, skip first st, tr in each st across.
Row 10: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across working last sc in top of beg ch-4.
Rows 11-38: Rep 7-10 for 7 more times.
Rows 39 and 40: Rep Rows 7 and 8.
Rows 41-46: Ch 1, turn, hdc in each st across.

# FINISHING

Weave in ends.

# SIZES

About 16 x 64 in. (40.5 x 16.5 cm)

# MATERIALS

LION BRAND® LB COLLECTION® FIFTY FIFTY (Art. #479)

#133 Rust 1 donut (A)

#157 Sunshine 1 donut (B)

#101 Pink 1 donut (C)

#105 Winter Sky 1 donut (D)

#123 Mineral 1 donut (E)

LION BRAND® large-eyed blunt needle

# State St

# ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

Crochet hook size Q (15 mm)

# GAUGE

1 Granny Square = about 6 x 6 in. (15 x 15 cm). BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

# NOTES

- 1. Wrap is made from 16 Granny Squares.
- 2. Each square is worked in joined rnds, using a different yarn color for each rnd.
- 3. An edging is then worked along 3 sides of each Granny Square.
- 4. Squares are sewn into 2 Strips of 8 Squares each then Strips are sewn together to form Wrap.

# **GRANNY SQUARES** (make 16)

**Note:** Use a different yarn color – your choice of colors A-D - for each rnd of each square. Yarn color E will be used later in the edging rnd.

Wrap yarn color of your choice around index finger. Insert hook into ring on finger, yarn over and draw up a loop. Carefully slip ring from finger and work the stitches of Rnd 1 into the ring.

**Rnd 1 (RS):** Ch 3 (counts as dc), 2 dc in ring, (ch 3, 3 dc in ring) 3 times, ch 3: join with sl st in top of beg ch-3 – One 3-dc group along each of 4 sides between corner ch-3 sps.

Fasten off.

Gently but firmly, pull tail to tighten center of ring.

**Rnd 2:** From RS, draw up a loop of next yarn color in any corner ch-3 sp, ch 3 (counts as dc), (2 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in same corner ch-3 sp, \* ch 1, (3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in next corner ch-3 sp; rep from \* 2 more times, ch 1; join with sl st in top of beg ch-3 – Two 3-dc groups and 1 ch-1 sp along each of 4 sides between corner ch-3 sps.

Fasten off.

**Rnd 3:** From RS, draw up a loop of next yarn color in any corner ch-3 sp, ch 3 (counts as dc), (2 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in same corner ch-3 sp, \* ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in next corner ch-3 sp; rep from \* 2 more times, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1; join with sl st in top of beg ch-3 – Three 3-dc groups and 2 ch-1 sps along each of 4 sides between corner ch-3 sps.

Fasten off.

# Edging

From RS, draw up a loop of E in any corner ch-3 sp, ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), (3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1) twice (for top edging), (3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in next corner ch-3 sp, ch 1, (3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1) twice, ch 1 (for side edging), (3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in next corner ch-3 sp, ch 1, (3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1) twice, 3 dc in next corner ch-3 sp (for bottom edging); leave remaining sts unworked (for unedged side) – Four 3-dc groups and 3 ch-1 sps along each of 2 sides, three 3-dc groups, 1 dc, and 3 ch-1 sps along 1 side.

# FINISHING

## **Assemble Strips**

With RS of Squares facing, lay Squares onto a flat surface.

Arrange 8 Squares into a Strip, placing unedged sides along the right side of the Strip and lining up the 3-dc groups of top edging of each Square with the ch-1 sps of the bottom edging of the next Square.

Sew Squares together.

Rep to make a 2nd Strip.

Place the edged sides of the 2 Strips together so that the 3-dc groups of one Strip line up with the ch-1 sps of the other Strip along long edge.

Sew the Strips together.

Weave in ends.

## SKILL LEVEL – Easy+

## <u>SIZE</u>

About 27 x 57 in. (68.5 x 145 cm) at longest and widest

## MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® Vanna's Style® (Art. #867)
  - 107 Sky 1 ball (A)
  - 114 Denim 1 ball (B)
  - 110 Navy 1 ball (C)
- Lion Brand<sup>®</sup> crochet hook size I-9 (5.5 mm)
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle

## GAUGE

15 dc + 8 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm). BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

## NOTES

- 1. Shawl is worked beginning at center back neck and is shaped with increases.
- 2. A border is worked around the outside edge of the Shawl.
- 3. The yarn colors are changed to make stripes. To change yarn color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete st. Fasten off old color and proceed with new color.
- 4. A Stitch Diagram is provided to clarify construction of the Shawl.

## SHAWL

With A, ch 7; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

**Row 1:** Ch 4 (counts as first dc and ch 1 in this row and in all following rows), (7 dc, ch 2, 7 dc, ch 1, dc) in ring – you will have 16 dc, 2 ch-1 sps, and 1 center ch-2 sp at the end of this row.

**Row 2:** Ch 4, turn, dc in first dc, ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc, (ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc) to center ch-2 sp, ch 1, (dc, ch 2, dc) in center ch-2 sp, ch 1, dc in next dc, (ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc) to turning ch-sp, ch 1, (dc, ch 1, dc) in 3rd ch of turning ch – 14 dc, 12 ch-1 sps, and 1 center ch-2 sp.

**Row 3:** Ch 4, turn, dc in first dc, (ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc) to center ch-2 sp, ch 1, (dc, ch 2, dc) in center ch-2 sp, ch 1, dc in next dc, (ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc) to turning ch-sp, ch 1, (dc, ch 1, dc) in 3rd ch of turning ch – 18 dc, 16 ch-1 sps, and 1 center ch-2 sp.

**Row 4:** Ch 4, turn, dc in first dc, (ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc) to center ch-2 sp, ch 1, (dc, ch 2, dc) in center ch-2 sp, ch 1, dc in next dc, (ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc) to turning ch-sp, ch 1, (dc, ch 1, dc) in 3rd ch of turning ch - 22 dc, 20 ch-1 sps, and 1 center ch-2 sp.

**Row 5:** Ch 4, turn, dc in first dc, (dc in next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc) to center ch-2 sp, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in center ch-2 sp, dc in next dc, (dc in next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc) to turning ch-sp, dc in turning ch-sp, (dc, ch 1, dc) in 3rd ch of turning ch - 48 dc, 2 ch-1 sps, and 1 center ch-2 sp.

**Rows 6-37:** Rep Rows 2-5 for 8 more times changing color as follows: Work 12 more rows with A, then 4 rows with B, 4 rows with A, 8 rows with B, and 4 rows with C - 304 dc, 2 ch-1 sps, and 1 center ch-2 sp at the end of Row 37. Do not fasten off.

#### Border

**Round 1:** Continuing with C, ch 3, do not turn, working in ends of rows along long straight edge, sk end of first row, sl st in end of next row, (ch 3, sl st in end of next row) to center ring, (ch 3, sl st in center ring) twice, (ch 3, sl st in end of next row) to end of long straight edge working last sl st in turning ch-sp, (ch 3, sk next 2 dc, sl st in next dc) to center ch-2 sp, (ch 3, sl st in center ch-2 sp) twice, ch 3, sk next 2 dc, sl st in next dc) to end of rnd. Fasten off.

#### FINISHING

Weave in ends.

#### Fringe


For each fringe, cut 4 strands of C, each about 10 in. (25.5 cm) long. Hold strands together and fold in half. With crochet hook, draw fold through ch-3 sp, making a yarn loop. Pull ends of strands through this loop and tighten. Make fringe in every other ch-3 sp along diagonal edges of Shawl. Trim fringe ends evenly.

# **SKILL LEVEL –** EASY

# SIZES

**Finished Wingspan** About 96 in. (244 cm) **Finished Length** About 46 in. (117), from lower point to center back neck

# MATERIALS

- LION BRAND<sup>®</sup> LET'S GET COZY: RE-SPEKT (Art. #844) #148 Plumberry 3 balls (A) #134 Sunstone 3 balls (B) #103 Mesa 3 balls (C)
- LION BRAND<sup>®</sup> crochet hook size H-8 (5 mm)
- LION BRAND<sup>®</sup> large-eyed blunt needle



# GAUGE

16 sts (four (3 dc, ch 1) groups) = about 4 in. (10 cm). BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

# NOTES

- 1. Shawl is worked in one piece, back and forth in rows, beg at center back neck.
- 2. Increases are worked at sides and center of each row to shape Shawl.
- 3. The yarn color is changed following a Stripe Sequence. To change yarn color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete st. Proceed with new color. Fasten off old color.

# **STRIPE SEQUENCE**

Work (4 rows with A, 2 rows with B, 4 rows with C, 2 rows with B) 5 times, work 4 rows with A, 2 rows with B, 3 rows with C, 2 rows with B, and 1 row with A for a total of 72 rows in Stripe Sequence.

# SHAWL

With A, ch 6; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

**Row 1:** Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc, ch 1, dc) in ring – you will have two 3-dc groups, 2 ch-1 sps, 1 center ch-2 sp, and a dc at beg and end of this row.

**Row 2:** Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), turn, 3 dc in first ch-1 sp, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in center ch-2 sp, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 1, dc) in last ch-sp – Four 3-dc groups, 4 ch-1 sps, 1 center ch-2 sp, and a dc at beg and end of row.

**Row 3:** Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), turn, 3 dc in first ch-1 sp, ch 1, 3 dc n next ch-1 sp, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in center ch-2 sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 1, dc) in last ch-sp – Six 3-dc groups, 6 ch-1 sps, 1 center ch-2 sp, and a dc at beg and end of row.

**Row 4:** Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), turn, 3 dc in first ch-1 sp, \* ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp; rep from \* to center ch-2 sp, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in center ch-2 sp, \*\* ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp; rep from \*\* to last ch-1 sp, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 1, dc) in last ch-sp and change to B in last st – Eight 3-dc groups, 8 ch-1 sps, 1 center ch-2 sp, and a dc at beg and end of row.

**Rows 5 and 6:** With B, rep Row 4 twice. Change to C in last st of Row 6 – Twelve 3-dc groups, 12 ch-1 sps, 1 center ch-2 sp, and a dc at beg and end of row in Row 6.

Rep Row 4 and continue to change yarn color following Stripe Sequence until all 72 rows of Stripe Sequence have been completed – One hundred and forty-four 3-dc groups, 144 ch-1 sps, 1 center ch-2 sp, and a dc at beg and end of Row 72.

Fasten off.

#### STITCH EXPLANATIONS

**Dec (Decrease)** Pick up lp in each of next 2 sts, yo and pull though all 3 lps. **Dbl Dec (Double Decrease)** Pick up lp in next st, skip next st, pick up lp in next st, yo and pull through all 3 lps.

**Triple Dec (Triple Decrease)** (Pick up lp in next st, skip next st) twice, yo and pull through all 4 lps.

Dbl Inc (Double Increase) 3 sc in same sp.

- **Picot 4** Pick up Ip in next st, yo and draw through first Ip, yo and draw through both Ips for foundationless-sc, (pick up Ip in bottom ch of foundationlesssc, yo and draw through first Ip, yo and draw through both Ips for another foundationless sc) 4 times, 2 sc in bottom ch of last foundationless-sc worked, sc in bottom ch of each of remaining 4 foundationless-sc.
- **Picot 3** Pick up lp in next st, yo and draw through first lp, yo and draw through both lps for foundationless-sc, (pick up lp in bottom ch of foundationlesssc, yo and draw through first lp, yo and draw through both lps for another foundationless sc) 3 times, 2 sc in bottom ch of last foundationless-sc worked, sc in bottom ch of each of remaining 3 foundationless-sc.
- **Picot 2** Pick up Ip in next st, yo and draw through first Ip, yo and draw through both Ips for foundationless-sc, (pick up Ip in bottom ch of foundationlesssc, yo and draw through first Ip, yo and draw through both Ips for another foundationless sc) 2 times, 2 sc in bottom ch of last foundationless-sc worked, sc in bottom ch of each of remaining 2 foundationless-sc.

#### SHAWL

With larger hook and MC, loosely ch 102.

**Row 1 (WS):** With smaller hook, working into BACK bumps of ea ch across, dec first 2 ch tog, \* sc in each of next 8 ch, dbl inc in next ch, sc in each of next 8 ch, dbl dec over next 3 ch; rep from \* across, end with dec last 2 ch tog instead of dbl dec - 101 sts.

**Row 2**- Ch 1 and turn, working into FRONT LPS, dec first 2 sts tog, \* sc in each of next 8 sts, dbl inc in next sc, sc in each of next 8 sts, dbl dec over next 3 sts; rep from \* across, end with dec last 2 sts tog instead of dbl dec and picking up last lp of last st going through BOTH lps.

Row 3: Rep Row 2, fasten off MC.

**Row 4 (RS):** With H, beg with slip knot on larger hook, sl st into first st through BOTH lps, sl st in each st across through FRONT lps to last st, sl st in last st through BOTH lps, go back to smaller hook.

**Row 5**: Ch 1 and turn, dec first 2 sts tog, \* sc in each of next 8 sts, picot 4 in next st, sc in each of next 8 sts, dbl dec over next 3 sts; rep from \* across, end with dec last 2 sts tog instead of dbl dec - 141 sts, fasten off H.

Row 6: With D, Rep Row 4.

**Row 7**: Ch 1 and turn, dec first 2 sts tog, \* sc in each of next 10 sts, (picot 3 in next st, sc in next st) 3 times, sc in each of next 9 sts, dbl dec over next 3 sts; rep from \* across, end with dec last 2 sts tog instead of dbl dec – 251 sts, fasten off D.

Row 8: With C, Rep Row 4.

**Row 9**: Ch 1 and turn, dec first 2 sts tog, \* sc in next st, picot 2 in next st, sc in next st, dbl dec over next 3 sts, sc in each of next 7 sts, (dbl inc in next st, sc in each of next 2 sts, trp dec over next 5 sts, sc in next st, drop lp from hook, insert hook in 3rd st to the right or into st before trp dec, place dropped lp back on hook and draw through, sc in next st) twice, dbl inc in next st, sc in each of next 7 sts, dbl dec over next 3 sts, sc in next st, picot 2 in next st, sc in each of next 7 sts, dbl dec over next 3 sts, sc in next st, picot 2 in next st, sc in next st, dbl dec over next 3 sts; rep from \*, end with dec last 2 sts tog instead of dbl dec - 251 sts, fasten off C.

With NS, Skip first 5 sts, change color, beg with slip knot on larger hook, sl st into next st through BOTH lps, sl st in each st across through FRONT lps to last 6 sts, sl st in next st through BOTH lps, skip last 5 sts and go back to smaller hook – 241 sts.

**Row 11**: Ch 1 and turn, \* sc in each of next 3 sts, trp dec over next 5 sts, sc in next st, drop lp from hook, insert hook in 3rd st to the right or into st before trp dec, place dropped lp back on hook and draw through, sc in next st, drop lp from hook, insert hook in st to the right of or into st before last pulled-through st, place dropped lp back on hook and draw through, sc in each of next 10 sts, dbl inc in next st, sc in each of next 12 sts,

trp dec over next 5 sts, sc in next st, drop lp from hook, insert hook in 3rd st to the right or into st before trp dec, place dropped lp back on hook and draw through, sc in next st, drop lp from hook, insert hook in st to the right of or into st before last pulled-through st, place dropped lp back on hook and draw through +,

sc in each of next 3 sts, trp dec over next 5 sts, sc in next st, drop lp from hook, insert hook in 3rd st to the right or into st before trp dec, place dropped lp back on hook and draw through, sc in next st, drop lp from hook, insert hook in st to the right of or into st before last pulled-through st, place dropped lp back on hook and draw through; rep from \*, end at +, sc in last st – 139 sts, fasten off NS.

#### Row 12:

#### Note

Don't forget to work into the LAST sts that have dropped lps pulled through, there are 3 per rep.

With I, beg with slip knot on larger hook, sl st into first st through BOTH lps, skip next st, sl st in each st across through FRONT lps to last st 2 sts, skip next st, sl st in last st through BOTH lps, go back to smaller hook – 137 sts.

**Row 13**: Ch 1 and turn, dbl dec over first 3 sts, sc in next st, \* sc in each of next 8 sts, dbl inc +, sc in each of next 11 sts, trp dec over next 5 sts, sc in next st, drop lp from hook, insert hook in 3rd st to the right or into st before trp dec, place dropped lp back on hook and draw through, (sc in next st, drop lp from hook, insert hook in st to the right of or into st before last pulled-through st, place dropped lp back on hook and draw through) twice; rep from \*, end at +, end sc in each of next 9 sts, dbl dec over last 3 sts–135 sts, fasten off l.

#### Row 14:

#### Note

This is the transition row where you do **NOT** slip st but begin with the ripple pattern again. (**Note** – don't' forget to work into the LAST sts that have dropped lps pulled through, there is 1 per rep but it is the skipped st of a dbl dec).

With MC, skip first st, beg with slip knot and dec next 2 sts tog, \*sc in each of next 8 sts, dbl inc in next sc, sc in each of next 8 sts, dbl dec over next 3 sts; rep from \* across, to last 3 sts, end with dec last 2 sts tog instead of dbl dec and picking up last lp of last st going through BOTH lps, skip last st – 101 sts.

Row 15: Rep Row 2.

Rep Rows 2 through 15 for pattern (a 14-row repeat) reversing color sequence - I, NS, C, D and H.

Then, rep the original color sequence or H, D, C, NS and I and then the reverse alternately until 12 repeats total have been worked, end with an extra repeat of Row 2 (a RS row).

Do NOT fasten off MC.

#### **FINISHING**

#### Trim

**Rnd 1:** From RS with MC, rotate piece and sc evenly along side edge working 3 sc in corners. With RS still facing, rotate piece and work in ripple pattern across bottom foundation chain, work 3 sc in corners. With RS still facing, rotate piece and sc evenly along side edge working 3 sc in corners. With RS still facing, work in ripple pattern across last row going through BOTH lps instead of just front lps. Join with sl st to corner st.

**Rnd 2 (WS):** Ch 1 and turn, work in FRONT lps and sc in ea sc around working in ripple pattern at top and bottom edges and working 3 sc in corners, join with sl st to first sc.

**Rnd 3 (RS):** Ch 1 and turn, work in BOTH lps and sc in ea sc around working in ripple pattern at top and bottom edges and working 3 sc in corners, join with sl st to first sc.

**Rnd 4 (RS):** With RS still facing and larger hook, sl st in each st around. Fasten off.

#### Blocking

The Shawl requires aggressive steam blocking.

Lay Shawl WS facing onto a flat, heat resistant surface that you can pin into. Use blocking wires or pins to stretch the Shawl into shape to match the finished measurements.

# Homespun

#### GAUGE:

11 sts + 4 rows = 4 in. (10 cm) in pattern.

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

#### STITCH EXPLANATION:

**BPDC (back post double crochet)** Yarn over, insert hook from back to front then to back, going around post of indicated st, draw up a loop, (yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) twice. Sk st in front of the BPDC.

**FPDC (front post double crochet)** Yarn over, insert hook from front to back then to front, going around post of indicated st, draw up a loop, (yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) twice. Sk st behind the FPDC.

**FPSC (front post single crochet)** Insert hook from front to back then to front, going around post of indicated st, draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through both loops on hook. Skip st behind the FPSC.

Ig-shell (large-shell) Work (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in indicated st or ch-sp.
picot Ch 3, sl st in 3rd ch from hook.
sm-shell (small shell) Work (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in indicated ch-sp.
V-st (V-stitch) Work (dc, ch 1, dc) in indicated st or ch-sp.

#### NOTES:

1. Shawl is worked back and forth in rows beg at center back neck.

2. Shawl is worked with 2 colors. To change color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete st. Proceed with new color.

#### SHAWL

With A, ch 5.

**Row 1:** Lg-shell in 5th ch from hook (beg ch counts as dc, ch 1), ch 1, dc in same ch – 1 lg-shell, 2 ch-1 sps, 1 dc at beg of row, and 1 dc at end of this row.

**Row 2:** Ch 4 (always counts as dc, ch 1), turn, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, lg-shell in ch-2 sp of center lg-shell, ch 1, 3 dc in beg ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of beg ch – 1 lg-shell, two 3-dc groups, 4 ch-1 sps, 1 dc at beg of row, and 1 dc at end of this row.

**Row 3:** Ch 4, turn, 3 dc in first ch-1 sp, ch 1, 3-dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, lg-shell in ch-2 sp of center lg-shell, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, 3 dc in turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch – 1 lg-shell, four 3-dc groups, 6 ch-1 sps, 1 dc at beg of row, and 1 dc at end of this row.

**Row 4:** Ch 4, turn, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, dc in each dc and ch-1 sp to center ch-2 sp, sm-shell in center ch-2 sp, dc in each dc and ch-1 sp to turning ch-sp, 2 dc in turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch – 1 sm-shell, 28 dc, and 2 ch-1 sps.

**Row 5:** Ch 4, turn, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, FPDC around each dc to center ch-2 sp, sm-shell in center ch-2 sp, FPDC around each dc to turning ch-sp, 2 dc in turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch – 1 sm-shell, 36 dc, and 2 ch-1 sps.

**Row 6:** Ch 4, turn, 3 dc in first ch-1 sp, \*ch 1, sk next 3 sts, 3 dc in next st; rep from \* to 3 sts before center ch-2 sp, ch 1, sk next 3 sts, lg-shell in center ch-2 sp, \*\*ch 1, sk next 3 sts, 3 dc in next st; rep from \*\* to 3 sts before turning ch-sp, ch 1, sk next 3 sts, 3 dc in turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch - 1 lg-shell, ten 3-dc groups, 12 ch-1 sps, 1 dc at beg of row, and 1 dc at end of this row.

**Row 7:** Ch 4, turn, 3 dc in first ch-1 sp, \*ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp; rep from \* to center lg-shell, ch 1, lg-shell in ch-2 sp of center lg-shell, \*\*ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp; rep from \*\* to turning ch-sp, ch 1, 3 dc in turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch – 1 lg-shell, twelve 3-dc groups, and 14 ch-1 sps.

**Rows 8-19:** Rep last 4 rows 3 more times – 1 lg-shell, thirty-six 3-dc groups, and 38 ch-1 sps at the end of Row 19.

**Rows 20 and 21:** Rep Rows 4 and 5 – 1 sm-shell, 164 dc, and 2 ch-1 sps at the end of Row 21.

Change to B.

**Row 22:** Ch 4, turn, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, \*FPDC around next st, dc in next 3 sts, FPDC around next st, sk next st, V-st in next st, sk next st; rep from \* to 3 sts before center ch-2 sp, FPDC around next st, dc in next 2 sts, (dc, ch 2, dc) in center ch-2 sp, dc in next 2 sts, FPDC around next st, \*\*sk next st, V-st in next st, sk next st, FPDC around next st, dc in next 3 sts, FPDC around next st; rep from \*\* to turning ch-sp, 2 dc in turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch – 20 V-sts (10 across each diagonal side edge).

**Row 23:** Ch 4, turn, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, dc in next 2 sts, BPDC around next st, \*dc in next 3 sts, BPDC around next st, sk next st, V-st in ch-1 sp of next V-st, sk next st, BPDC around next st; rep from \* to 3 sts before center ch-2 sp, dc in next 3 sts, (2 dc, ch 1, dc, ch 2, dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in center ch-2 sp, dc in next 3 sts, BPDC around next st, \*\*sk next st, V-st in ch-1 sp of next V-st, sk next st, BPDC around next st, dc in next 3 sts, BPDC around next st; rep from \*\* to 2 sts before turning ch-sp, dc in next 2 sts, 2 dc in turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch.

**Row 24:** Ch 4, turn, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, FPDC around next st, sk next st, V-st in next st, sk next st, \*FPDC around next st, dc in next 3 sts, FPDC around next st, sk next st, V-st in next ch-1 sp, sk next st; rep from \* to center ch-2 sp, (dc, ch 2, dc) in center ch-2 sp, \*\*sk next st, V-st in next ch-1 sp, sk next st, FPDC around next st, dc in next 3 sts, FPDC around next st; rep from \*\* to 4 sts before turning ch-sp, sk next st, V-st in next st, V-st in next st, Sk next st, V-st in next st, V-st in next st, V-st in next st, Sk next st, V-st in next st, V-st in next st, Sk next st, V-st in next st, V-st in next st, V-st in next st, Sk next st, V-st in next st, A st next st, V-st in next st, Sk next st, V-st in next st, Sk next st, V-st in next st, 2 dc in turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch - 24 V-sts (12 across each diagonal side edge).

**Row 25:** Ch 4, turn, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, dc in next 2 sts, BPDC around next st, sk next st, V-st in ch-1 sp of next V-st, sk next st, BPDC around next st, \*dc in next 3 sts, BPDC around next st, sk next st, V-st in ch-1 sp of next V-st, sk next st, BPDC around next st; rep from \* to center ch-2 sp, Ig-shell in center ch-2 sp, BPDC around next st, sk next st, V-st in ch-1 sp of next V-st, sk next st, V-st in ch-1 sp of next V-st, sk next st, BPDC around next st, sk next st, V-st in ch-1 sp of next V-st, sk next st, BPDC around next st, sk next st, V-st in ch-1 sp of next V-st, sk next st, BPDC around next st, \*\*dc in next 3 sts, BPDC around next st, sk next st, V-st in ch-1 sp of next V-st, sk next st, BPDC around next st; rep from \*\* to 2 sts before turning ch-sp, dc in next 2 sts, 2 dc in turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch.

**Row 26:** Ch 4, turn, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, FPDC around next st, dc in next 3 sts, \*FPDC around next st, sk next st, (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in ch-1 sp of next V-st, sk next st, FPDC around next st, dc in next 3 sts; rep from \* to center ch-2 sp, lg-shell in center ch-2 sp, dc in next 3 sts, FPDC around next st, \*\*sk next st, (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in ch-1 sp of next V-st, sk next st, dc in next 3 sts, FPDC around next st, \*\*sk next st, (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in ch-1 sp of next V-st, sk next st, FPDC around next st, dc in next 3 sts, FPDC around next st; rep from \*\* to turning ch-sp, 2 dc in turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch.

**Rnd 27:** Ch 1, turn, sc in first st, picot, sk first ch-1 sp, sc in next 2 sts, FPSC around next st, sc in next 3 sts, FPSC around next st, \*sc in next 2 sts, picot, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next 2 sts, FPSC around next st, sc in next 3 sts, FPSC around next st; rep from \* to 2 sts before center ch-2 sp, sc in next 2 sts, picot, sk center ch-2 sp, sc in next 2 sts, FPSC around next st, sc in next 3 sts, FPSC around next st, sc in next 3 sts, FPSC around next st, sc in next 3 sts, FPSC around next st, sc in next 3 sts, FPSC around next st, sc in next 3 sts, FPSC around next st, sc in next 3 sts, FPSC around next st, sc in next 3 sts, FPSC around next st; rep from \*\* to 2 sts before turning ch-sp, sc in next 2 sts, picot, sc in 3rd ch of turning ch; working in ends of rows across long straight top

**Crochet Hook:** Steel crochet hook Size 2.35 mm [US 1]. Tapestry needle Red and blue thread for markers

**GAUGE:** Each motif =  $2^{3}$ / $^{"}$  square. **CHECK YOUR GAUGE.** Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

#### SHAWL First Strip First Motif

Ch 5; join with a slip st in first ch to form a ring. **Round 1:** Ch 4 (counts as first tr), 15 tr in ring – 16 tr. **Round 2:** Slip st in space between ch-4 and next tr, ch 7, sc between next 2 tr, \*ch 3, tr between next 2 tr, ch 3, sc between next 2 tr; repeat from \* 6 times, ch 3; join with slip st in 4th ch of beginning ch-7 – 8 tr; 8 sc; 16 ch-3 spaces. **Round 3:** Ch 1, sc in first st, \*ch 7, sc in next tr, ch 11 for corner, sc in next tr; repeat from \* twice, ch 7, sc in next tr, ch 11; join with a slip st in first sc – 4 ch-7 loops; 4 ch-11 loops. Fasten off.

#### Second Motif

Work same as First Motif through Round 2.

**Round 3:** Ch 1, sc in first st, ch 7, sc in next tr, ch 7, sc in 8th ch of a ch-11 corner loop on previous motif and mark the ch-7 just made with red thread, ch 3, sc in next tr on Second Motif, ch 3, sc in 4th ch of next ch-7 loop on previous motif, ch 3, sc in next tr on Second Motif, ch 3, sc in 4th ch of next ch-11 corner loop on previous motif, ch 7, sc in next tr on Second Motif, ch 7, sc in next tr, ch 11, sc in next tr, ch 7, sc in next tr, ch 11; join with slip st in first sc, mark last loop with blue thread. Fasten off. Loop marked with red will be used later.

#### **Third Motif**

Work same as Second Motif, making first joining on Round 3 in the 8th ch of corner loop marked with blue on previous motif. Remove blue marker on previous motif.

Make 22 more motifs; joining each motif to previous motif same as Third Motif was joined to Second Motif, omitting blue marker on last motif (25 motifs).

#### Second Strip

#### **First Motif**

Work same as First Motif of First Strip through Round 2.

**Round 3:** Ch 1, sc in first st, ch 7, sc in next tr, ch 7, skip next 3 ch on red marked corner loop on Second Motif of previous strip, then sc in next ch, ch 3, sc in next tr on current motif, ch 3, sc in 4th ch of next ch-7 loop on Second Motif of previous strip, ch 3, sc in next tr on current motif, ch 3, sc in 4th ch on next corner loop on Second Motif of previous strip, ch 7, sc in next tr on current motif, ch 7, sc in next tr, ch 11, sc in next tr, ch 7, sc in next tr, ch 11; join with a slip st in first sc. Fasten off.

#### Second Motif

Work same as First Motif of First Strip through Round 2.

**Round 3:** Ch 1, sc in first st, ch 7, sc in next tr, ch 7, sc in 8th ch of loop marked with blue on previous motif, mark the ch-7 just made with red, ch 3, sc in next tr on current motif, ch 3, sc in 4th ch on next ch-7 loop on previous motif, ch 3, sc in next tr on current motif, ch 3, sc in 4th ch of next corner loop on previous motif, ch 3, skip next 3 ch on corner loop on next motif of previous strip, sc in next ch, ch 3, sc in next tr on current motif, ch 3, sc in 4th ch of next ch-7 loop of previous motif, ch 3, sc in 4th ch of next ch-7 loop of previous motif, ch 3, sc in next tr on current motif, ch 3, skip next 3 ch on corner loop of previous motif, sc in next ch, ch 7, sc in next tr on current motif, ch 7, sc in next tr, ch 11; join with a slip st in first sc. Mark last loop worked with blue. Fasten off. Remove blue marker on previous motif.

Make 21 more motifs; joining each to previous motifs same as last motif, omitting red marker on all remaining motifs and blue marker on last motif only -23 motifs.

#### **Remaining Strips**

Work 11 more strips same as Second Strip, with each successive strip having 1 less motif at each end of strip as established until 1 motif remains. Do not press.

#### **Border and Fringe**

With right side facing; join yarn to 8th ch of corner loop on first motif of long edge.



#### MATERIALS

- 790-407 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Homespun Yarn:</u> <u>Painted Desert</u> 2 Balls (A)
- 790-414 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Homespun Yarn:</u> <u>Amethyst</u> 1 Ball (B)
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size K-10.5 (6.5 mm)
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

#### GAUGE:

11 sts + 4 rows = 4 in. (10 cm) in pattern.

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

#### Making a Gauge Swatch

#### STITCH EXPLANATION:

**BPDC (back post double crochet)** Yarn over, insert hook from back to front then to back, going around post of indicated st, draw up a loop, (yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) twice. Sk st in front of the BPDC.

Homespun

**FPDC (front post double crochet)** Yarn over, insert hook from front to back then to front, going around post of indicated st, draw up a loop, (yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) twice. Sk st behind the FPDC.

**FPSC (front post single crochet)** Insert hook from front to back then to front, going around post of indicated st, draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through both loops on hook. Skip st behind the FPSC.

Ig-shell (large-shell) Work (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in indicated st or ch-sp. picot Ch 3, sl st in 3rd ch from hook.

sm-shell (small shell) Work (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in indicated ch-sp.

V-st (V-stitch) Work (dc, ch 1, dc) in indicated st or ch-sp.

#### NOTES:

1. Shawl is worked back and forth in rows beg at center back neck.

2. Shawl is worked with 2 colors. To change color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete st. Proceed with new color. Fasten off old color.

3. At the end of the rows in this pattern you will see a notation like this - 1 lg-shell, 2 ch-1 sps, 1 dc at beg of row, and 1 dc at end of this row. The stitches and numbers that appear after the '- ' tell you exactly what you should have at the end of the row.



#### SHAWL

With A, ch 5.

**Row 1:** In the 5th ch from the hook work a Lg-shell, then ch-1 and dc in the same ch. The beg ch (the first 4 chs) counts as a ch-1 and a dc, so at the end of Row 1 you will have one Lg-shell with a ch-1, dc on each side of it.

**Row 2:** Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1 in this row and in all following rows), turn, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, lg-shell in ch-2 sp of center lg-shell, ch 1, 3 dc in beg ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of beg ch – 1 lg-shell, two 3-dc groups, 4 ch-1 sps, 1 dc at beg of row, and 1 dc at end of this row.

**Row 3:** Ch 4, turn, 3 dc in first ch-1 sp, ch 1, 3-dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, lg-shell in ch-2 sp of center lg-shell, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, 3 dc in turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch – 1 lg-shell, four 3-dc groups, 6 ch-1 sps, 1 dc at beg of row, and 1 dc at end of this row.

**Row 4:** Ch 4, turn, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, dc in each dc and ch-1 sp to center ch-2 sp, sm-shell in center ch-2 sp, dc in each dc and ch-1 sp to turning ch-sp, 2 dc in turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch – 1 sm-shell, 28 dc, and 2 ch-1 sps.

**Row 5:** Ch 4, turn, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, FPDC around each dc to center ch-2 sp, sm-shell in center ch-2 sp, FPDC around each dc to turning ch-sp, 2 dc in turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch – 1 sm-shell, 36 dc, and 2 ch-1 sps.

**Row 6:** Ch 4, turn, 3 dc in first ch-1 sp, \*ch 1, sk next 3 sts, 3 dc in next st; rep from \* to 3 sts before center ch-2 sp, ch 1, sk next 3 sts, lg-shell in center ch-2 sp, \*\*ch 1, sk next 3 sts, 3 dc in next st; rep from \*\* to 3 sts before turning ch-sp, ch 1, sk next 3 sts, 3 dc in turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch – 1 lg-shell, ten 3-dc groups, 12 ch-1 sps, 1 dc at beg of row, and 1 dc at end of this row. **Row 7:** Ch 4, turn, 3 dc in first ch-1 sp, \*ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp; rep from \* to center lg-shell, ch 1, lg-shell in ch-2 sp of center lg-shell, \*\*ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp; rep from \*\* to turning ch-sp, ch 1, 3 dc in turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch - 1 lg-shell, twelve 3-dc groups, and 14 ch-1 sps. **Rows 8-19:** Rep last 4 rows 3 more times – 1 lg-shell, thirty-six 3-dc groups, and 38 ch-1 sps at the end of Row 19.

**Rows 20 and 21:** Rep Rows 4 and 5 – 1 sm-shell, 164 dc, and 2 ch-1 sps at the end of Row 21. Change to B.

**Row 22:** Ch 4, turn, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, \*FPDC around next st, dc in next 3 sts, FPDC around next st, sk next st, V-st in next st, sk next st; rep from \* to 3 sts before center ch-2 sp, FPDC around next st, dc in next 2 sts, (dc, ch 2, dc) in center ch-2 sp, dc in next 2 sts, FPDC around next st, \*\*sk next st, V-st in next st, sk next st, FPDC around next st, dc in next 3 sts, FPDC around next st; rep from \*\* to turning ch-sp, 2 dc in turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch – 20 V-sts (10 across each diagonal side edge).

**Row 23:** Ch 4, turn, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, dc in next 2 sts, BPDC around next st, \*dc in next 3 sts, BPDC around next st, sk next st, V-st in ch-1 sp of next V-st, sk next st, BPDC around next st; rep from \* to 3 sts before center ch-2 sp, dc in next 3 sts, (2 dc, ch 1, dc, ch 2, dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in center ch-2 sp, dc in next 3 sts, 8PDC around next st, \*\*sk next st, V-st in ch-1 sp of next V-st, sk next st, BPDC around next st, at a sts, before turning ch-sp, dc in next 2 sts, 2 dc in turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch.

**Row 24:** Ch 4, turn, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, FPDC around next st, sk next st, V-st in next st, sk next st, \*FPDC around next st, dc in next 3 sts, FPDC around next st, sk next st, V-st in next ch-1 sp, sk next st; rep from \* to center ch-2 sp, (dc, ch 2, dc) in center ch-2 sp, \*\*sk next st, V-st in next ch-1 sp, sk next st, FPDC around next st, dc in next 3 sts, FPDC around next st; rep from \*\* to 4 sts before turning ch-sp, sk next st, V-st in next st, sk next st, FPDC around next st, 2 dc in turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch - 24 V-sts (12 across each diagonal side edge).

**Row 25:** Ch 4, turn, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, dc in next 2 sts, BPDC around next st, sk next st, V-st in ch-1 sp of next V-st, sk next st, BPDC around next st, \*dc in next 3 sts, BPDC around next st, sk next st, V-st in ch-1 sp of next V-st, sk next st, BPDC around next st; rep from \* to center ch-2 sp, lg-shell in center ch-2 sp, BPDC around next st, sk next st, V-st in ch-1 sp of next V-st, sk next st, sk next st, V-st in ch-1 sp of next V-st, sk next st, BPDC around next st; rep from \* to center ch-2 sp, lg-shell in center ch-2 sp, BPDC around next st, sk next st, V-st in ch-1 sp of next V-st, sk next st, BPDC around next st, \*\*dc in next 3 sts, BPDC around next st, sk next st, V-st in ch-1 sp of next V-st, sk next st, BPDC around next st; rep from \*\* to 2 sts before turning ch-sp, dc in next 2 sts, 2 dc in turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch.

**Row 26:** Ch 4, turn, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, FPDC around next st, dc in next 3 sts, \*FPDC around next st, sk next st, (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in ch-1 sp of next V-st, sk next st, FPDC around next st, dc in next 3 sts; rep from \* to center ch-2 sp, lg-shell in center ch-2 sp, dc in next 3 sts, FPDC around next st, \*\*sk next st, (2

dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in ch-1 sp of next V-st, sk next st, FPDC around next st, dc in next 3 sts, FPDC around next st; rep from \*\* to turning ch-sp, 2 dc in turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch. **Rnd 27:** Ch 1, turn, sc in first st, picot, sk first ch-1 sp, sc in next 2 sts, FPSC around next st, sc in next 3 sts, FPSC around next st, \*sc in next 2 sts, picot, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next 2 sts, FPSC around next st, sc in next 3, sc, FPSC around next st; rep from \* to 2 sts before center ch-2 sp, sc in next 2 sts, picot, sk center ch-2 sp, sc in next 2 sts, FPSC around next st; rep from \* to 2 sts before center ch-2 sp, sc in next 2 sts, picot, sk center ch-2 sp, sc in next 2 sts, FPSC around next st; rep from \* to 2 sts, picot, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next 3 sts, FPSC around next st; rep from \* to 2 sts, picot, sk sts, FPSC around next st, \*\*sc in next 2 sts, picot, sk center ch-2 sp, sc in next 2 sts, FPSC around next st, sc in next 3 sts, FPSC around next st; rep from \*\* to 2 sts before turning ch-sp, sc in next 2 sts, picot, sc in 3rd ch of turning ch; working in ends of rows across long straight top edge, work 2 sc in end of each row all the way across; join with sl st in first sc of this rnd. Fasten off.

#### FINISHING

Weave in ends.





In single crochet, using US size J-10 (6mm) hook, 10 sts and 12 rows = 4"/10 cm

#### INSTRUCTIONS

#### HELPFUL

Chain loosely or use a larger hook (US size K-10.5 (10.5 mm)) to work the foundation chain.
 To make a narrower wrap, chain 62 to begin. This will create a wrap about 20"/51cm wide.

#### WRAP

With MC, ch 74.

**Row 1:** Sc in second ch from hook and next 3 ch, ch 7, skip next 5 ch, \*sc in next 7 ch, ch 7, skip next 5 ch; repeat from \* to last 4 ch, sc in last 4 ch, turn—6 ch-7 sp.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in first 3 sc, ch 5, skip next sc, skip next 3 ch, sc in next ch (center ch of ch-7 sp), ch 5, skip next 3 ch, skip next sc, \*sc in next 5 sc, ch 5, skip next sc, skip next 3 ch, sc in next ch, ch 5, skip next 3 ch, skip next sc; repeat from \* across to last 3 sc, sc in last 3 sc, turn—12 ch-5 sp.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in first 2 sc, ch 5, skip next sc, skip next 4 ch, sc in next ch, sc in next sc, sc in next ch, ch 5, skip next 4 ch, skip next sc, \*sc in next 3 sc, ch 5, skip next sc, skip next 4 ch, sc in next ch, sc in next sc, sc in next ch, ch 5, skip next 4 ch, skip next 4 ch, skip next sc; repeat from \* across to last 2 sc, sc in last 2 sc, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 1, sc in first sc, ch 5, skip next sc, skip next 4 ch, sc in next ch, sc in next 3 sc, sc in next ch, ch 5, skip next 4 ch, skip next sc, \*sc in next sc, ch 5, skip next sc, skip next 4 ch, sc in next ch, sc in next 3 sc, sc in next ch, ch 5, skip next 4 ch, skip next 4 ch, skip next 3 sc, sc in next ch, ch 5, skip next 4 ch, skip next 4 ch, skip next sc; repeat from \* across to last sc, sc in last sc, turn.

**Row 5:** Ch 7 (counts as tr, ch 3), skip first sc, skip next 4 ch, sc in next ch, sc in next 5 sc, sc in next ch, \*ch 7, skip next 4 ch, skip next sc, skip next 4 ch, sc in next ch, sc in next 5 sc, sc in next ch; repeat from \* across to last chsp, ch 3, skip last 4 ch, tr in last sc, turn.

**Row 6:** Ch 1, sc in first tr, ch 5, skip first ch-3 sp, skip next sc, sc in next 5 sc, ch 5, skip next sc, \*skip next 3 ch, sc in next ch (center ch of ch-7 sp), ch 5, skip next 3 ch, skip next sc, sc in next 5 sc, ch 5, skip next sc; repeat from \* across to last ch-sp, sc in 4th ch of beginning ch-7, turn.

**Row 7:** Ch 1, sc in first sc, sc in next ch, ch 5, skip next 4 ch, skip next sc, sc in next 3 sc, ch 5, skip next sc, \*skip next 4 ch, sc in next ch, sc in next sc, sc in next ch, ch 5, skip next 4 ch, skip next sc, sc in next 3 sc, ch 5, skip next sc; repeat from \* across to last ch-sp, skip last 4 ch, sc in next ch, sc in last sc, turn.

**Row 8:** Ch 1, sc in first 2 sc, sc in next ch, ch 5, skip next 4 ch, skip next sc, sc in next sc, ch 5, skip next sc, skip next 4 ch, sc in next ch, \*sc in next 3 sc, sc in next ch, ch 5, skip next 4 ch, skip next sc, sc in next sc, ch 5, skip next sc, skip next 4 ch, sc in next ch; repeat from \* across to last 2 sc, sc in last 2 sc, turn.

**Row 9:** Ch 1, sc in first 3 sc, sc in next ch, ch 7, skip next 4 ch, skip next sc, skip next 4 ch, sc in next ch, \*sc in next 5 sc, sc in next ch, ch 7, skip next 4 ch, skip next sc, skip next 4 ch, sc in next ch; repeat from \* across to last 3 sc, sc in last 3 sc, turn. Repeat Rows 2–9 until piece measures 65"/165 cm, or desired length, end by working a Row 5. Do not fasten off.

#### FINISHING

**Rnd 1:** Pivot to work in ends of rows along long side, work 2 sc around each tr or ch-3 sp and 1 sc around each sc along side; pivot to work in the free loops on the opposite side of the foundation chain, sc in the base of each sc, 6 sc in each ch-5 sp across foundation ch; pivot to work in ends of rows along the opposite long side of piece, work 2 sc around each tr or ch-3 sp and 1 sc around each sc along side; pivot to work in the sts of the last row of wrap, 3 sc in first and last ch-3 sp, sc in each sc, 6 sc in each ch-7 sp across row; join with slip st in first sc. Fasten off.

**Rnd 2 (picot rnd):** Join CC anywhere in edge, \*(sc, ch 3, slip st in 3rd ch from hook, sc) in next sc, skip next sc; repeat from \* around edge; join with slip st in first sc. Fasten off Weave in all ends. Lay piece flat and wet block as desired.



**Row 3:** Ch 6 (counts as dc, ch 3 here and throughout), turn, dc in first dc, ch 1, sk next 2 dc, dc in next 3 dc, ch 1, sk next 2 dc, (dc, ch 3, dc, ch 3, dc) in next dc, ch 1, sk next 2 dc, dc in next 3 dc, ch 1, sk next 2 dc, (dc, ch 3, dc) in top of turning ch.

**Row 4:** Ch 3, turn, 7 dc in first ch-3 sp, ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sk next dc, dc in next dc (middle dc of 3-dc group), ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, 7 dc in next ch-3 sp, dc in next dc, 7 dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sk next dc, dc in next dc (middle dc of 3-dc group), ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, 7 dc in turning ch-sp, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch.

**Row 5:** Ch 6, turn, dc in first dc, ch 1, sk next 2 dc, dc in next 3 dc, ch 1, sk next 2 dc, sk next ch-1 sp, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next dc, ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sk next 2 dc, dc in next 3 dc, ch 1, sk next 2 dc, (dc, ch 3, dc, place marker in dc just made for center dc, ch 3, dc) in next dc, ch 1, sk next 2 dc, dc in next 3 dc, ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next dc, ch 1, sk next 2 dc, dc in next 3 dc, ch 1, sk next 2 dc, dc in next 3 dc, ch 1, sk next 2 dc, dc in next 3 dc, ch 1, sk next 2 dc, dc in next 3 dc, ch 1, sk next 2 dc, dc in next 3 dc, ch 1, sk next 2 dc, (dc, ch 3, dc) in top of turning ch.

**Row 2:** With B, ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, dc in first st, sk first ch-1 sp, \*ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp; rep from \* across, ch 1, 2 dc in 3rd ch of turning ch – Fourteen 3-dc groups, 15 ch-1 sps, and 4 dc (one 2-dc group at each end of row). Change to C.

**Row 3:** With C, ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), turn, 3 dc in first ch-1 sp, \*ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp; rep from \* to last 2 dc, ch 1, sk next dc, dc in top of turning ch – Fifteen 3-dc groups, 16 ch-1 sps, and 2 dc.

Row 4: With C, rep Row 2.

Change to B.

Rows 5 and 6: With B, rep Rows 3 and 4.

Change to C.

Rows 7 and 8: With C, rep Rows 3 and 4.

Change to D.

Rows 9 and 10: With D, rep Rows 3 and 4.

Change to C.

Rows 11 and 12: With C, rep Rows 3 and 4. Fasten off.

#### Second Side Panel

From RS, working across opposite side of foundation ch, join B with sl st in ch at base of first hdc.

**Row 1 (RS):** With B, ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), 3 dc in ch at base of next V-st, \*ch 1, 3 dc in ch at base of next Shell, ch 1, 3 dc in ch at base of next V-st; rep from \* across, ch 1, dc in last ch – 15 V-sts, 16 ch-1 sps, and 2 dc. **Rows 2-12:** Work same as Rows 2-12 of first side panel. Change to B.

#### Border

**Rnd 1 (RS):** Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, 2 dc in first ch-sp, \*ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp; rep from \* across, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in turning ch-sp for corner; working in ends of rows across long edge, \*\*ch 1, sk next row, 3 dc in end of next row;

rep from \*\* across edge, ch 1; working in sts along short edge, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in first ch-1 sp for corner, \*\*\*ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp; rep from \*\*\* to last ch-sp, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in last ch-sp for corner; working in ends of rows across long edge, \*\*\*\*ch 1, sk next row, 3 dc in end of next row; rep from \*\*\*\* across edge, ch 1, 3 dc in last ch-sp, ch 2; join with sl st in top of beg ch. Fasten off.

**Rnd 2:** From RS, join C with sl st in any ch-1 sp, ch 3 (counts as dc), 2 dc in same ch-1 sp, \*ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp; rep from \* around, working (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in each corner ch-2 sp; join with sl st in top of beg ch. Fasten off.

Rnd 3: With D, rep Rnd 2.

DO NOT fasten off.

**Rnd 4:** With D, ch 1, skipping the ch-1 sps, work rev sc in each dc and corner ch-2 sp around; join with sl st in beg ch. Fasten off.

#### **FINISHING**

Weave in ends.

#### Yarn used

Stylecraft Candy Swirl DK 3 balls in your chosen colourway

#### About the yarn

DK; 443m per 150g; 100% acrylic

#### Hook used

4mm

#### Start crocheting

**Row 1:** Working into a magic ring, 3 ch (counts as tr throughout), 6 tr into ring, place stitch marker in 4th tr (point st). Turn. 7 sts

Hint: Continue to move stitch marker up to point st in each row.

- Row 2 (WS): 3 ch, 1 tr in first st, 2 tr, 5 tr in point st, 2 tr, 2 tr in top of 3 ch. Turn. 13 sts, 6 tr per side plus point tr
- Row 3 (RS): 3 ch, 2 tr in first st, 5 tr, 3 tr in point st, 5 tr, 3 tr in top of 3 ch. Turn. 19 sts, 9 tr per side plus point tr
- **Row 4:** As Row 2. 25 sts, 12 tr per side plus point tr
- **Row 5**: As Row 3. 31 sts, 15 tr per side plus point tr

#### **Bobble Row**

Bobble rows are always worked on wrong side.





Row 6: 1 ch, 2 dc in first st, 2 dc, [bobble in next st, 5 dc] across to point st, [2 dc, bobble, 2 dc] in point st, [5 dc, bobble in next st] across to last 3 sts, 2 dc, 2 dc in top of 3 ch. Turn. *37 sts* 

#### **Double Crochet Rows**

- **Row 7:** 3 ch, 2 tr in first st, tr across to bobble at point, 3 tr in bobble, tr across to last st, 3 tr in last st. Turn. *43 sts*
- **Row 8:** 3 ch, 1 tr in first st, tr across to point, 5 tr in point st, tr across to last st, 2 tr in top of 3 ch. Turn. *49 sts*
- Row 9: 3 ch, 2 tr in first st, tr across to point, 3 tr in point st, tr across to last st, 3 tr in top of 3 ch. Turn. 55 sts

Rep rows 6-9 another 14 times, then Row 6 once more. *397 sts, 198 sts per side plus 1 point bobble* Hint: Your bobbles will all line up as you

increase, and each patt repeat increases by 2 bobbles per side.

#### **Edging & Bobble border**

Rnd 1: 1 ch, 2 dc in first st, dc across to bobble at point, 3 dc in bobble, dc across to last st, 2 dc in last st, rotate to work along top edge, (Hint: keep your sl sts loose to stop your edge from curling), 1 ch, sl st across row ends placing 1 sl st in each dc row-end and 2 sl sts in each





tr row-end to centre ring, 1 sl st in centre ring, continue as before to last row end, 1 ch, join with sl st into beg dc. Do not turn. 636 sts, 235 sl-st, 401 dc, 200 dc per side, plus point dc

Rnd 2: 1 \*4 ch, 2 & 3 beg bobble in first ch from hook, 4 make a 2nd beg bobble sit on top of first, fold in half with RS together, sl st into ch first bobble was worked into, sl st into first ch of first beg bobble, 5 4 ch, miss 5 dc on shawl edge, sl st in next dc; rep from \* across bottom two edges of shawl, making final sl st in last dc, (Hint: at point, sl st will be 3rd st before point st and 3rd st after, still missing 5 sts), rotate to work along top edge, 1 ch, 1 dc in 1ch-sp, dc across to next 1ch-sp, 1 dc in 1ch-sp.

Fasten off. Weave in ends.

#### **Special stitches**

**Bobble Stitch (Bbl):** [Yrh, insert hook into indicated st, yrh, pul] 5 times into same stitch, draw through all 6 loops on hook

Beginning Bobble Stitch: (beg bobble): 2 ch, [yrh, insert hook into indicated st, yrh, pul] 4 times into same stitch, draw through all 5 loops on hook

● 3 skeins Red Heart® Super Saver® Yarn, Carrot

• Yarn needle

• Crochet hook Size 10½ or size to obtain gauge GAUGE: 12 sts = 4"; 8 rows = 4".

## DIRECTIONS: Ch 43.

Row 1: (RS) Hdc in 2nd ch from hook and in each chain across, turn -42 hdc.

Row 2: Ch 1, hdc in each hdc across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, hdc in first 14 hdc, \*skip next hdc, work Fpdc around next hdc one row below, working in front of Fpdc just made, work Fpdc around hdc one row below skipped hdc, hdc in next 2 hdc; rep from \* 2 times more, skip next hdc, work Fpdc around next hdc one row below, working in front of Fpdc just made, work Fpdc around hdc one row below, working in front of Fpdc just made, work Fpdc around hdc one row below skipped hdc, hdc in last 14 hdc, turn. Row 4: Rep Row 2. Row 5: Rep Row 3. Rows 6-20: Rep Rows 2-3 until 20 rows have been completed.

## SPLIT FOR SECTIONS:

**1ST SIDE SECTION:** 

Row 21: Ch 1, keeping in pattern as established, work 18 sts, turn. Leave remaining sts unworked.

Row 22: Ch 1, hdc in all sts across — 18 sts. Rows 23-35: Work in pattern as established on 18 sts. Fasten off. CENTER SECTION:

Row 21: RS facing & holding previous section behind work, join yarn in 17th st on Row 21 of Wrap for Center Section of Split, hdc in next 2 sts, work in pattern as established for 8 more sts -10 sts. Rows 22-35: Work as established on 10 sts. Fasten off.

**3RD SIDE SECTION** 

Row 21: RS facing & holding previous section in front of work, join yarn in 25th st on Row 21 of Wrap for 3rd Section of split, hdc in next 2 sts, work in pattern as established to end of row -18 sts. Rows 22-35: Work as established on 18 sts. Do not fasten off, turn.

JOIN SECTIONS: Row 36 (WS): Ch 1, hdc in first 16 hdc, working through corresponding sts of sections, hold Center Section behind Side Section and hdc through both layers to join 2 overlapped sts, hdc across Center Section sts, hdc overlapped sts of Center Section with remaining Side Section – 42 hdc. Row 37: Rep Row 3. Rows 38-149: Rep Rows 2-3, end with Row 3. Do not fasten off.

EDGING: RS facing, work reverse sc evenly spaced around all edges. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

Finished size 14"x80".



Insert hook between single back strand and front 2 strands. Yoh and draw up a loop (fig. D). Yoh and draw through both loops on hook (sc) (figs. E and F).

#### INSTRUCTIONS:

Note: Each sc is always base for SK (fig. G). With MC, ch 2.

Foundation Rnd: (RS). Ch 1.1 sc in 2nd ch from hook. (SK) 4 times. Join with sc


to first sc. Turn.



Row 1: (RS). \*(SK) 3 times. 1 sc in next sc. Rep from \* once more. Turn. Row 2: Ch 4 (counts as 1 tr). Skip first SK. 1 sc in next sc. (SK) 3 times. 1 sc in next sc. (SK) twice. 1 sc in next sc. (SK) 3 times. 1 sc in last sc. Turn. Row 3: (WS). Ch 4 (counts as 1 tr). Skip first SK. 1 sc in next sc. (SK) 3 times. 1 sc in next sc. \*(SK) twice. 1 sc in next sc. Rep from \* to last sc. (SK) 3 times. 1 sc in last sc. Turn.

Rep Row 3 until work across last row measures approx 55" [139.5 cm].

Final Row: (SK) twice. Skip first SK. 1 sc in next sc. \*SK. Skip next sc. 1 sc in next sc. Rep from \* to last sc. (SK) twice. 1 sc in last sc. Fasten off.

Care Wear Volunteers, Inc. is a national 501 (c)3 nonprofit organization that recruits participants to knit, crochet, and/or sew for hospitals, nursing homes, pregnancy centers, cancer centers, etc. Bonnie Hagerman began knitting preemie hats for NICUs in 1990 as a personal community service project. She was interested in a community service project that was compatible with her full-time teaching schedule. She was not interested in an organization that had strict attendance and quantity requirements. She wanted a project that could be done any time in the year—not just at Christmas! When she realized how many items were needed, she decided to recruit others to help.

At first, Care Wear Volunteers focused on making hats and kimonos for premature infants in NICUs, but hospitals requested donated items for other age groups in many different departments of the hospital. The list of needed items grew!!!!

Participants in Care Wear Volunteers do what they can, when they can. They are encouraged to donate in their own communities in order to help one's neighbors and to save money on expensive postage costs. Participants provide the supplies for their projects and deliver or mail their finished items directly to the hospital, nursing home, Food Bank, pregnancy center or Cancer Treatment center of their choice. Bonnie does not collect finished items.

Care Wear Volunteers participants pay no dues or membership fees. There are no quotas and no record keeping requirements. There are no required meetings to attend. Once or twice per year, there is a *Make a Difference Day* community service event. A quarterly newsletter connects participants, updates hospital information, and provides patterns to supplement the Care Wear Volunteers Pattern & Information Book (2018) that is on the Care Wear Volunteers website (www.carewear.org).
